

Foxlake Adventures

There's wakeboarding, the unique Foxfall overwater ropes course, Ringo rides, open water swimming and their inflatable obstacle course, Aqua Park, which first opened in 2023. Inveresk Lodge Gardens

Inveresk Lodge Garden is a tranquil hillside garden and pond nestled in a characterful little village just outside Edinburgh. Wander among fragrant flowers and towering trees as meadows meet woodland at the foot of the garden.

The walled garden's themed borders transform with the seasons, offering year-round delights from snowdrops and tulips to perfumed roses.

Wildlife lovers should keep their eyes peeled too, with swans, ducks, geese, tits, herons, and treecreepers often sighted around the water and woodland. If you're lucky, you might even spot a kingfisher!

John Muir's Birthplace

One of the top things to do in East Lothian for explorers young and old. John Muir's Birthplace tells the incredible life story of a famous Scot who, 100 years on, still inspires climate action today.

• Learn all about Treasure Island author Robert Louis Stevenson, who based some of his finest work on his childhood holidays in East Lothian, at the Coastal Communities Museum.

• The John Gray Centre is close to the stunning 400-yearold St Mary's Parish Church, where John Knox, leader of Scotland's reformation, instigated repairs after it was damaged during the last Anglo-Scottish wars in the 1500s.





Dirleton Castle

Dirleton Castle & Gardens

This magnificent fortress-residence is a wonder to behold for history lovers, green-thumbs and hopeless romantics. Dirleton Castle was home to three successive noble families over a four-century period, before being heavily damaged by Oliver Cromwell's siege in 1650.

In the 1660s, the Nisbet family took ownership and began to breathe new life into the old ruins and gardens. It even has its own chapel, originally built for the private use of the Haliburton lords, meaning Dirleton is not only a stunning place to visit, but a popular wedding location too!

Dogs are welcome, but are not permitted in roofed areas.

National Museum of Flight

Discover one of Europe's best collections of aircraft at this historic airfield and enjoy a supersonic experience on board Scotland's Concorde. Then get hands on, with over 25 interactive exhibits in the family-friendly Fantastic Flight gallery.

Fly back in time to learn about the history of aviation from the First World War right through to the present day, then hear the stories of the brave men and women who worked at the museum's home on East Fortune Airfield, in the Fortunes of War gallery.

Newhailes House & Gardens


Wandering round the 300-year-old halls of Newhailes House is like a journey back in time. This beautiful Palladian location played an important role in the Scottish Enlightenment and is packed with secrets and curios waiting to be discovered.

The stunning gardens and grounds offer outdoor activities and events including woodland walks with views across the Forth.

Weehailes Adventure Playpark offers great fun for the kids, while accompanying adults can enjoy refreshments from the Stables Café and maybe a scoop or two at the 'The Dairy' ice cream parlour.

Preston Mill & Phantassie Doocot

The quirky architecture and Dutch-style conical roof of Preston Mill have enchanted countless visitors, photographers, and painters over the years.

Incredibly, the historic Preston Mill remained active all the way up to 1959, making it East Lothian's last working watermill. Be sure not to miss the guided tour, which delves into the hard graft of a miller's life - from heavy lifting to dealing with floods, mice and more.

Other things to do nearby include discovering the Phantassie Doocot, built in the 16th century and once home to 500 pigeons.

Scottish Seabird Centre

For a 'wild' day out by the sea, visit The Scottish Seabird Centre's award-winning visitor experience located in the stunning coastal town of North Berwick. Open year-round, the centre offers fun for the whole family, with seasonal events and boat trips for those who want to get up close to Scotland's incredible coastal wildlife.

From the warmth and comfort of the centre itself, you can virtually explore the wonders of Scotland's marine wildlife and habitats through a range of interactive displays, including virtual reality and live video.

Tantallon Castle

Clamber up to the battlements of one of Scotland's last medieval castles, which was finally abandoned after 300 years of resistance, under the pressure of not one, not two, but three sieges by Oliver Cromwell's army. Even in its ancient state Tantallon Castle is intimidating atop the cliff edge, with stunning views out to the iconic Bass Rock.

With such an embattled past, the castle has become an inspiring filming location. Nature lovers also flock here to sneak a peek of rare animals, birds, and plant life.

Distilleries and Breweries

Belhaven **Brewery Visitor** Experience

Discover Scotland's oldest working brewery nestled between the rolling barley fields of Dunbar and the beautiful Belhaven Bay, just 25 miles from Edinburgh. This highly acclaimed visitor experience draws on a brewing tradition that dates back over 300 years (since 1719) and showcases how the rich and fertile lands of East Lothian help to produce some of the country's finest craft beers and ales.

You'll learn all about the brewery's history and the brewing process as you take a fascinating tour around the site, uncovering iconic chimneys and a secret garden along the way.

Distilleries and Breweries

Glenkinchie Distillery

Whisky fans must visit Glenkinchie Distillery, the Lowland home of Johnnie Walker.

Go on a sensory journey as you explore this beautiful Victorian distillery, with fragrant orchard gardens surrounded by farmland and wildflower meadows. Discover the secrets of the master distillers who craft the rare Lowland style whisky, evoking fragrant flowers, dried cut grass, and nutty cereal. And no visit would be complete without sampling the lowland malt that's loved around the world, both on its own and as one of the four corners of Johnnie Walker.


