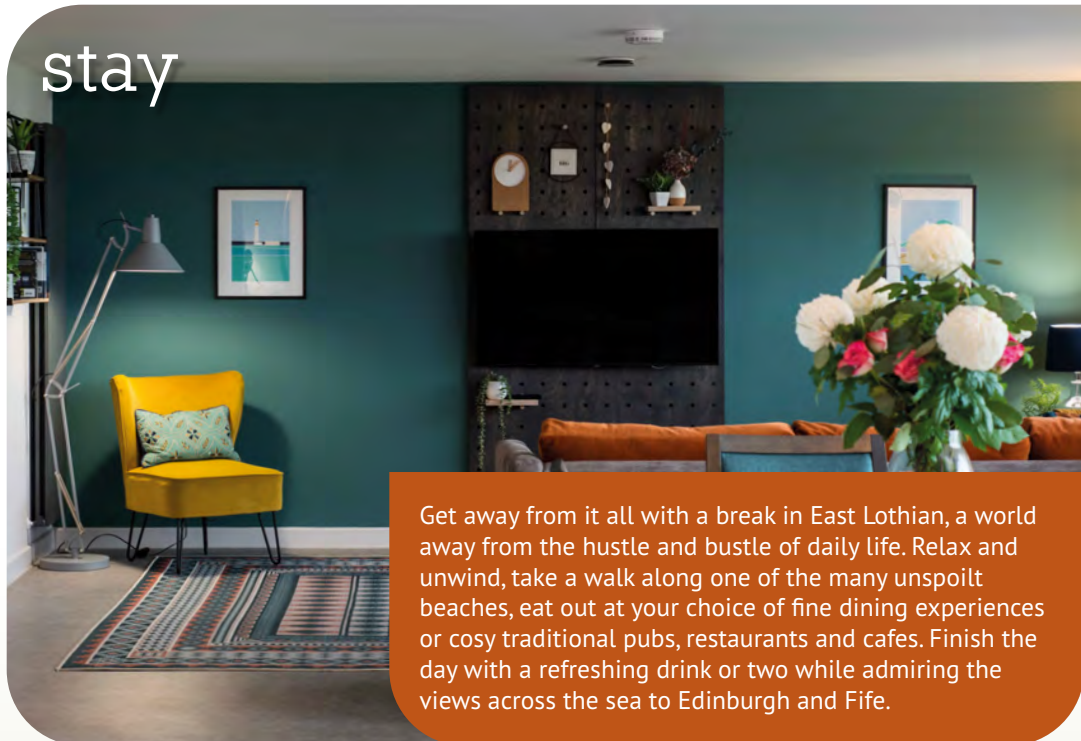

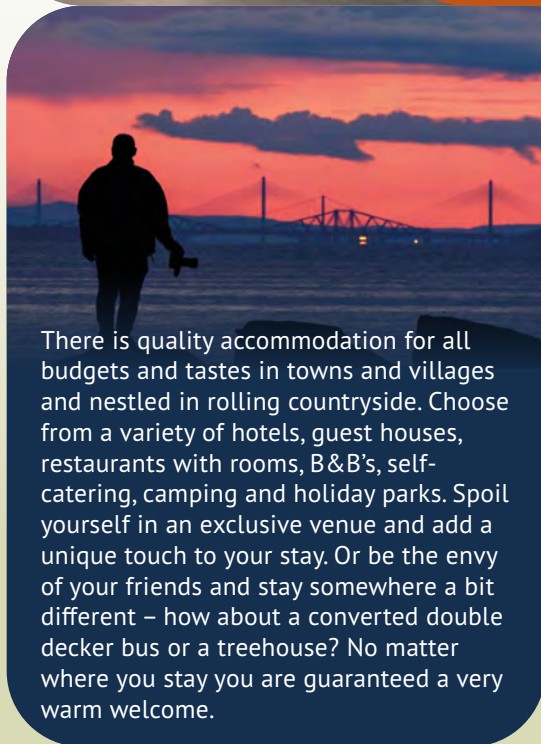

getting around

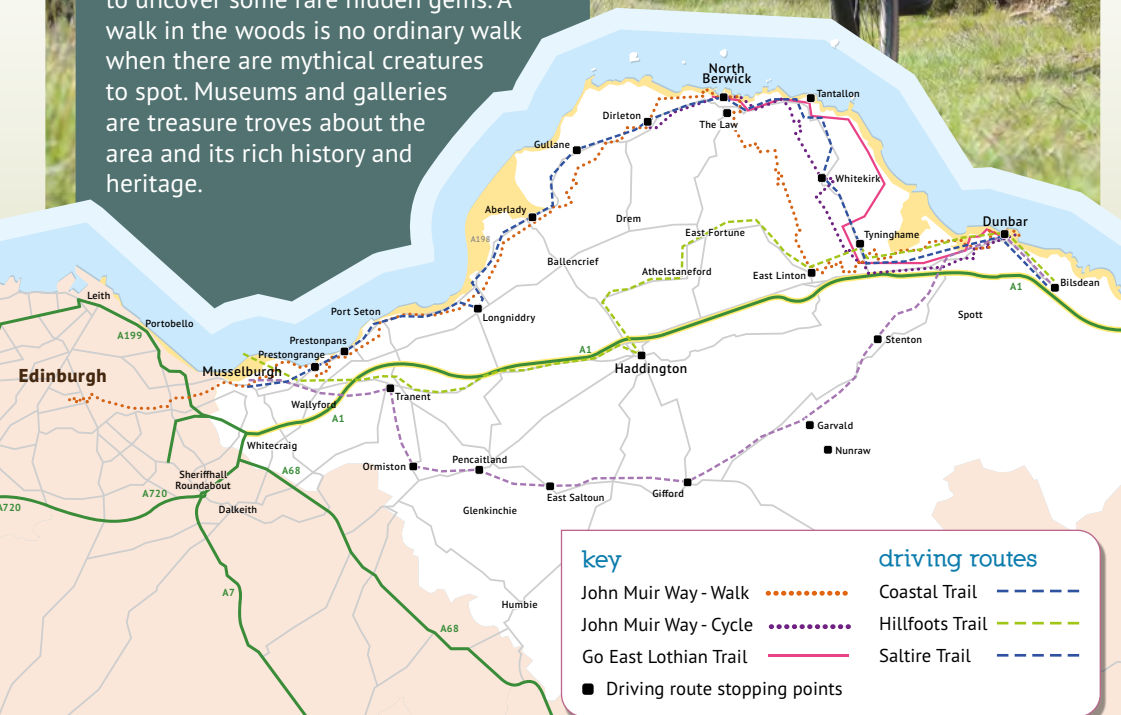
Walk or cycle along the John Muir Way, a long distance route between Dunbar and Helensburgh, and explore the beautiful places that you pass.

Shop to your heart's content and find unique gifts and souvenirs in the independent retailers which can be found in picturesque towns and villages.

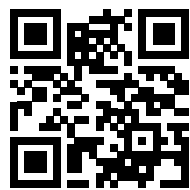


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
